Take safety seriously

- Every year in the United States, tens of thousands of people are killed or injured from contact with electricity. Some are children.
- Approximately 2,400 children receive emergency room treatment every year for injuries caused by inserting objects into electrical outlets, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission.

Follow these safety rules:



Stay away from power lines.

Before you climb a tree or fly a kite, look up and stay away from power lines.



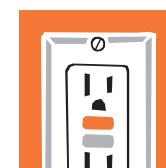
Mr. Ouch means danger.

Mr. Ouch appears on dangerous electrical equipment to warn of hazardous voltage. When you see Mr. Ouch, don't touch. He means danger.



Natural gas smells like rotten eggs.

If you smell a stinky rotten egg smell, do not turn off the lights or use a telephone. Tell an adult immediately. If no adult is around, get everyone out of the house and tell a trusted adult to call We Energies for help at 800-261-LEAK.



Outlets are for plugs.
