

2022 fuel filing



Wisconsin Electric Power Co., doing business as We Energies, filed a 2022 fuel cost plan on June 1, 2021, with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW). The plan includes an increase of \$29.4 million (3.51%) in the form of a fuel cost adjustment to cover expected 2022 fuel costs. The primary driver for the increase is higher prices for purchased power.

The monthly impact of the fuel cost adjustment on individual customer bills will vary depending on the customer rate class and amount of electricity used.

Customer class	2022 fuel increase
Residential*	\$0.81 or 0.76%
General Secondary**	\$2.46 or 1.04%
General Primary***	1.34%

* Assumes customer using 660 kilowatt-hours (kWh) per month.

** Assumes customer using 2,000 kWh per month.

*** It is difficult to identify any General Primary electric customer as a typical customer because there are many combinations of rate components that impact bills, which can vary significantly.

The actual amount of any rate adjustment will be determined by the PSCW, and the amount could be more or less than initially requested. The adjustment is prorated for customers participating in the Energy for Tomorrow program.
