

"Test sticks" are not a safe method to determine if a downed power line is energized. All downed power lines should be considered energized until an electric utility employee verifies and grounds the line.

If you see a downed power line:

- **1.** Establish a safety zone of 25 to 30 feet around the downed line and surrounding electric equipment to keep the public and nonauthorized personnel away.
- **2.** Do not attempt to move a downed power line. Power lines can become re-energized at any time by:
 - Automatic reclosers
 - Manual operation of closers or switches
 - Electric dispatch center attempts to re-establish service
 - Generator backfeed



Only trained electric utility employees using rated and tested personal protective equipment can determine if a power line is de-energized and safely move the line.
