After our work is complete, we put excavated soil back into the trench and leave it mounded to allow for settling. Excess soil, large rocks and other items found during excavation are left on your property for removal.

You will be responsible for additional restoration and lawn repair. This includes ruts that may be left behind by equipment used in muddy conditions.

Construction equipment

Work requirements and soil conditions determine the type of equipment we use, which includes excavating, boring or trenching equipment. We strive to use equipment that is as least disruptive as possible based on the circumstances.
